End of Year Celebration Reminder



Tiny Happy People

This website has been created to help parents develop their child's communication skills. There are simple activities and play ideas to explore and videos helping you discover more about your child's amazing early development. Did you know for example that playing with a ball has benefits for language development? Or have you wondered why your child asks so many 'why' questions? The answer is revealed here!

What is 30 hours Funded Childcare?

Most working parents of three and four year olds are eligible for an extra 15 hours of funded childcare a week, term time. Added to your current universal entitlement of 15 hours Funded Early Education for three and four year olds, this means that your entitlement will increase to a total of 30 hours a week, term time (or 1140 hours over a year). We are registered for 30 hours funded childcare term time and offer up to 24.75 hours. If you wish to claim all 30 hours some parents arrange for a childminder to cover the extra time.

If you think you might be eligible apply through the government's Childcare Choices website. There's 30 Hours Eligibility Guidance to help you understand whether you will qualify. If your application is successful, you'll get given an 11 digit eligibility code which you must then give us so that we can check your eligibility. A child can only take up their extended hours from the term following the date of issue of their 30 hour code. Eligibility code applications for the Autumn Term 2022 may be made up until August 31st.

Butterfly Life Cycle

Our caterpillars arrived recently and the children have been observing them grow larger and larger as they have eaten more and more food. They're now pupating on the roof of their container so we will be carefully transferring them to their new quarters very soon.



Alongside our observations we've been creating some butterfly patterns and talking about symmetry with the older children. We've also been using our small world props to help all of our children become really familiar with the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar.' It not only gives them an understanding of the life cycle of the butterfly but also provides opportunities for developing their counting as well as their recognition of numerals. Several children are now able to understand the concept of 'one more' and can tell you the new total number of fruit too.

If you see any butterflies flying around your garden or when out on walks do draw your child's attention to them and talk about their patterns and body parts.

Polio/Vaccination Reminder

You may have seen in the news that polio has been found in London sewage water - although this represents a small risk to the public, it's a timely reminder



to ensure children are fully up to date with their vaccinations. Polio vaccine is part of the routine national immunisation schedule. If you or your child are not up to date with your polio vaccinations it's important you contact your GP to catch up, or if unsure, check your Red Book.
